





Unemployment Rate (%)




Structure of the Gross Value Added (2015)

The sectors that reported the largest contribution to GVA in 2015 (share of 44%) were: Mining, quarrying and manufacturing and Wholesale and retail trade.



Exports of goods

Exports (FOB) in 2015 amounted to EUR 23.2 billion. In 2015 compared to a year earlier the exportation of investment goods increased by 16% and for consumer goods the growth was 7%.




Structure of exports by commodity groups in 2015


Imports of goods

According to the balance of payments data, at the end of 2015 imports reached EUR 26.4 billion. Imports of Consumer goods posted the most significant increase – 9% compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. With the highest rate in this commodity group was import of automobiles – 17% growth.



Tourism

Tourism plays an important role in Bulgaria because of its economic, social and employment potential. In 2015 Bulgaria was visited by 7.1 million tourists.

The ranking by number of tourists for 2015 is headed by Romania with 987 thousand tourists, followed by Greece with 973 thousand tourists and by Germany with 623 thousand tourists.





FDI by host country, 2010 - 2015 (€ mln.)






Total number of ranked countries




Total number of ranked countries





Cost of doing business - Bulgaria




Electricity 0.069(€/kWh)



Industrial Rents From 2.5 € (m2/month)







What Bulgaria offers



The government supports specific industries

under the Investment Promotion Act (IPA):

- Investments must be related to the following sectors:
 - Manufacturing
 - Research & development
 - Education
 - Healthcare
 - High-tech services
 - Warehousing and logistics
- Minimum investment amounts must exceed €2.5m
 - €1m in regions with high unemployment and €0.5m for investment projects in high-tech services
- Benefits for certified investors include:
 - Shortened administrative procedures
 - Preferential acquisition of state or municipal land
 - Financial support for professional training / education
 - Infrastructure subsidies
 - Labor cost subsidies
 - Individual administrative services

Administrative incentives

Information services

- Shortened administrative procedures -The central and local government authorities will provide administrative services shortened by 1/3rd of the time period established by the law
- Consulting and individual administrative services, provided by the Agency
- Establishmentofpublic-privatepartnershipswithmunicipalities,universities, otherorganizationsfrom theacademic society etc.
- Institutional Support by **establishing an intergovernmental group** to deal with possible obstacles for the investors
- Acquisition of real estate (private state or private municipal property) without a tender procedure and competition






Financial incentives

- Acquisition of the real estate with no tender and at a price lower than the market, but not lower than the tax assessment of the property.
- Financial support for construction of technical infrastructure elements to the borders of the project site, needed for implementation of one or more investment projects.
- Financial support for the **vocational training** for obtaining professional qualifications.
- Reimbursement of labor costs for social security paid by the employer.
- Financial grants for education, R&D and manufacturing projects.
 - State **tax exemption** for changing the land status from agricultural into industrial.






0% corporate tax in areas with unemployment 25% higher than the country average






ARBITRATION COURT

- Simplified procedure notified in advance to both the parties.
- The arbitration procedure is average 6 times faster than state court;
- Arbitration fee for cases with a value more than 1 mln. USD is 6 times cheaper than state court;
- The procedure is of one instance. 98 % of the cases are settled usually within 12 months.
- The arbitration awards are final;
- The parties and their legal and contractual representatives have electronic access to the cases.
